Nate Hill grew up fishing the Charles River in Franklin, MA. As a kid He vacationed in North Conway, and learned how to fly fish on the Ellis and Wildcat rivers. Nate attended UNH and fly fished the Lamprey, Cocheco and Isinglass rivers between classes. During the summer between his junior and senior year he completed a Fly Fishing Education internship with the FFF in Livingston, Montana. After graduating from UNH with a major in English teaching Nate landed a job teaching at Kennett High School in North Conway NH. He began guiding part time during summer vacations for North Country Angler Fly Shop. # **Ausable Wulff Dry Fly**

**Hook:** Mustad 94831 or equal 2x, fine dry fly hook sizes 8-18.

**Thread:** Fluorescent orange. **Tail:** Woodchuck tail fibers.

**Body:** Australian Opossum dyed rusty rat or equal.

**Wing:** White Calf tail upright and divided.

**Hackle:** Brown and Grizzly.



I will have full instruction sheets at the meeting and all the materials required to tie this fly. Years ago fishing a small stream in New Hampshire I got one hung up it a tree and had to brake it off while sitting on a rock tying on another one the flicker of a bird caught my attention I stopped tying and watched as the bird tried to pull the fly out of the tree thank goodness it was really hung up there.
